The Beresford School District held its annual Hall of Fame Ceremony on Saturday, September 18, over Homecoming weekend, recognizing individuals for their accomplishments and outstanding character. Awardees fall into one of four categories: Academics & Achievement, Fine Arts, Athletics, or Distinguished Service. This beloved and memorable occasion brings together the community and honors those who have positively impacted the educational quality and stature of Beresford Schools.



Mrs. Jane (Kennedy) Carlson is a 1972 graduate of Beresford High School. During her high school years, Jane received many awards through her participation in the arts, was a member of the Homecoming Royalty, and was selected for All-State Chorus. She also played some "mean" cymbals in band and contributed to the fine arts by taking roles in all offered productions, plays, and musicals.

After high school, Jane attended the University of South Dakota (USD). She graduated from USD in 1977 with both Elementary Education and Special Education degrees and was awarded the

"Outstanding Graduate in Special Education." She earned her Master's in Education from USD in 1996.

Mrs. Carlson has been the heart of both the activity and energy of the Beresford Area Arts (BAA) for the past three decades. She, along with a few others, rescued the BAA from extinction and revived it into a viable and essential community organization. She served selflessly as the chairperson of the organization and continuously provided the Beresford area with quality arts programs. Chief among the list of gifts to the community include a steady stream of outstanding musicals and theatrical productions.

Under her guidance as the executive director, the BAA has expanded its offerings to the community by hosting several unique events that celebrate the arts in the Beresford community. Part of this expansion includes the addition of opportunities for children's theatre as well as establishing scholarships for area students to attend theatre camp. These are just a few of the highlights of Jane's tenure as a leader in the arts movement in our community.

Jane's pedigree in the arts is strong and much has been said, and should be said, about Jane's mother, Mrs. Grace (Kylling) Kennedy and their influence in the arts in the Beresford community. That love for the arts and the ability to put that passion into action has been passed down from mother to daughter.
