Cultivating Lifelong Ties: Alums Connections



As an integral part of the Watchdog Foundation's mission, we want to make strong, mutually beneficial ties between the school district and its diverse alums. This summer, we embarked on a journey to reconnect with alums who had been recipients of the Shanna Rae Christensen Memorial Scholarship (SRCMS) and had graduated between 2011 and 2022. The Watchdog Foundation awarded the SRCMS to Beresford seniors pursuing health care, education, or rehabilitation studies. The scholarship has been a source of financial support, contributing a cumulative total of \$19,450 in 12 years. The average award amount per recipient thus far has been \$500.

Our outreach strategy encompassed a range of communication channels, including text messages, emails, and social media platforms. Notably, the involvement of the recipients' parents played a crucial role in facilitating these connections. Thanks, Mom and Dad! The response was overwhelming, with over 75% of the contacted alums sharing their stories and many expressing heartfelt gratitude for the financial assistance they received.

Remarkably, 84% of the alums stayed true to their original intentions, either establishing themselves in their chosen careers or continuing their education journeys in healthcare or education. Many of these Beresford alumni decided to pursue higher education in South Dakota, with over one-third choosing to live, work, and raise their families within the state.

In the realm of healthcare, the stories of our alums paint a diverse and inspiring picture:

- Nurses who thrive in a variety of roles ranging, from orthopedics and trauma to female pelvic medicine, to working with COVID patients their first year as a nurse, while another is leading other RNs in a managerial role.
- A Speech Therapist who makes a difference by working with deaf students and another embarking on a master's program in speech therapy as well as one entering physical therapy school to earn a doctorate.

- Flourishing careers in nutrition and sports dietetics to assist athletes in achieving their performance goals.
- Various roles, including research assistants, chiropractic assistants, dental assistants, certified nurse assistants, and laboratory technicians, showcase our alums' breadth of impact.
- One alumnus is on the verge of completing an Emergency Medicine and Family Medicine residency, paving the way for a future in medical practice.

On the education front, Beresford alums have ventured into diverse roles:

- Teachers spanning K-12 special education, 7th grade, 6th grade math, physical education, K-8 reading, and elementary art are shaping young minds.
- Coaches are fostering a culture of growth, collaboration, and resilience.

Beyond these pursuits, our alums have explored other careers:

- Successful business ownership has become a reality for one.
- Another has found a meaningful role in the state attorney's office, serving as a victim witness assistant.
- Specializations in psychology, criminal justice, and medical law highlight the breadth of academic pursuits our alums have embraced.




