
Graduation

On Saturday, May 13, 2023, at 2 pm, the Beresford School District recognized 62 graduating seniors. Principal Dr. Renee Anderson presided over the ceremony. The Beresford High School choir performed "I Am Still Your Dreamer" by Pinkzebra. The Watchdog Foundation Board is pleased to announce that Brenna Dann, Annie Farley, Irelyn Fickbohm, Adyson Hansen, and Eva Schaap earned a Shanna Rae Christensen Memorial Scholarship.

The David and Susan Christensen family, in memory of their daughter Shanna Rae, set up a special scholarship fund called the Shanna Rae Christensen Memorial Scholarship. The fund agreement was set up with the South Dakota Community Foundation as a sub-fund of the Watchdog Foundation and an affiliated fund of

the Beresford Area Foundation. The scholarship is for Beresford High School seniors whose intended plans for post-high study are in the area of special education, rehabilitation, or nursing. The senior must have two letters of recommendation from individuals who can speak to character and activity involvement. The senior must have a 3.0 GPA or higher, demonstrate good moral character, and be involved in the community, church and/ or school activities. Work and/or volunteer experience with special needs children is preferred but not required.





Watchdog Foundation Innovative Education Grants

The vision of the Watchdog Foundation is "Building the future of Beresford, together." Our mission is to assist and advance our community's pursuit of excellence, create lifelong connections, and build strong and mutually beneficial ties between the Beresford School District, the community, and its diverse alumni. This year, the Watchdog Foundation awarded \$7,500 worth of "Innovate Education" Grants." Grants were awarded to the following:

- Mrs. Ann Tornberg submitted a grant application to help send her National Debate Qualifiers to the National Competition in Phoenix, Arizona. The grant funds will help send two high school students and eleven middle school students to the competition.
- Dr. Renee Anderson was awarded a grant to help Beresford Middle School continue to implement its Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS). The PBIS program supports the academic and socialemotional growth of all students.

- Mrs. Amber Sorensen earned a grant from the Watchdog Foundation for the Girls on the Run program implemented at Beresford Elementary School. The program helps young girls learn how to handle emotions and social situations better while training for a 5K race.
- Mrs. Pratt submitted a grant application to help send Juliann Seeley to the National HOSA-Future Healthcare Leaders Conference in Dallas, Texas. Ms. Seeley is a back-to-back state champion in sports medicine.
